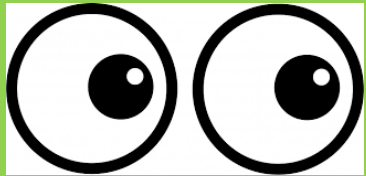




NEWS YOU CAN USE FROM THE LEARNING COMMONS! September 12- September 16, 2016
